FINAL ORDER

This matter came before the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission (the Commission) at a public meeting on November 9, 2017 in Sarasota, Florida. It was alleged by Administrative Complaint that the Respondent had violated specified sections of Chapter 943, Florida Statutes, and Chapter 11B-27, Florida Administrative Code. In a document submitted to the Commission, the Respondent chose to voluntarily relinquish her criminal justice certification to the Commission. After being duly noticed of this hearing, the Respondent neither appeared nor was represented by counsel at the meeting.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The allegations of fact set forth in the Administrative Complaint are supported by competent substantial evidence. In response to the Administrative Complaint, the Respondent did not admit the allegations of fact, but elected to voluntarily relinquish her certification to the Commission. In doing so, the

Respondent further agreed to waive her right to request a hearing to present mitigating evidence or a statement of denial to the Commission, or to dispute the allegations of fact before an Administrative Law Judge. The Respondent chose to voluntarily relinquish her certification freely and voluntarily. The Respondent's voluntary relinquishment is approved, adopted and incorporated herein by reference.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Commission has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of this case.

2. Under §943.1395, Florida Statutes, and Chapter 11B-27, Florida Administrative Code, the allegations of fact set forth in the Administrative Complaint constitute good legal grounds for taking disciplinary action against the Respondent.

It is therefore ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that:

1. The Respondent's voluntary relinquishment of her above referenced criminal justice certification is ACCEPTED.

2. The Respondent shall immediately surrender to the Commission her criminal justice certificate.

3. This Final Order will become effective upon filing with the Clerk of the Department of Law Enforcement.

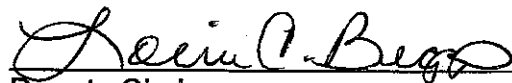
